Steve Munby began his career as a secondary school teacher (teaching 11 to 18 year-old pupils) in Birmingham, later moving to the North East of England where he worked as a teacher and then as a lecturer. In 1987, he became a consultant on student assessment and records of achievement, working for the nine local education authorities in North East England, before becoming an Inspector within the Education Department in Oldham, near Manchester, in 1989. He then managed the Advisory Service in Oldham before moving to Blackburn in 1997 as the area's Assistant Director of Education with responsibility for school improvement and lifelong learning. From 2000 to March 2005, he was Director of Education and Lifelong Learning in Knowsley, Merseyside. The work in Knowsley under his leadership has been documented in books by Andy Hargreaves and Dean Fink (*Sustainable Leadership*) and by Michael Fullan (*Leadership and Sustainability*) and (*The New Meaning of Educational Change, Fourth Edition*).

Steve has been Chief Executive of the National College for School Leadership in England since March 2005.

Steve's published works include his 1989 book *Assessing and Recording Achievement* and numerous articles included in educational and leadership publications over the past two decades.
